# Year 6 Curriculum Overview - Term 1, 2017

#### **Dear Parents**

Welcome back! We are thrilled to welcome your child to Year 6. It's great to see the children back at school motivated and ready to continue their learning journey at OLQP.

This overview contains an outline of the units covered throughout Term 1, along with some general information relating to Year 6.

## Religion

**Servant Leadership** - Students will study the Scriptural foundations of the Christian concept of servant leadership witnessed in the actions of Moses and the teachings and example of Jesus. As school leaders, students will be encouraged to apply these Christian ideals of leadership within their family, school and community context.

#### Lent: Year A - An Invitation to Believe

In this Lenten Unit students study the Gospel reading for the Fourth Sunday of Lent: 'Jesus cures the man born blind from birth' and explores its themes of faith and spiritual discernment in relation to Baptism and the celebration of the Season of Lent.

**Easter Unit: Crossroads - Easter Triduum -** Children will explore situations in their lives where they are faced with making decisions. They study key Gospel accounts of incidents during Jesus' passion and death that demanded decisions by Jesus and others.

### **Mathematics**

#### Strands covered:

- Whole Number
- Addition and Subtraction
- Position
- Data
- Fractions

Throughout all work in Mathematics the children will simultaneously be developing their skills of questioning, applying strategies, communicating their ideas, reasoning and reflecting on what they have done. They will use a variety of materials to support the development of deep mathematical understanding.

**Spelling -** Word families, spelling rules, theme words and personal words.

#### Geography


### Unit: "A Diverse and Connected World"

- Students explore countries of the Asia region and the connections Australia has with other countries across the world.
- Students learn about the diversity of the world's people, including the indigenous peoples of other countries.
- Students will explore and reflect upon similarities, differences and the importance of intercultural understanding.

# **Unit: Change Detectives**

- This unit provides opportunities for students to explore melting, evaporating, dissolving, burning and chemical reactions.
- Students' understanding of the factors that influence the rate of change will be developed through hands-on activities and student-planned investigations.
- Students become detectives who identify and explain physical and chemical changes in everyday materials.
