Warren has had an extensive career as a Primary Principal with the Catholic Education Office Sydney. He has been principal of several schools for over thirty years and an Education Officer with the Catholic Education Office for three years. In 2016, Warren was appointed Principal for children with an intellectual disability at St Lucy's Wahroonga.

Warren completed a research project on 'how boys' best learn' for the Catholic Education Office Sydney in 2012-13. He appeared on '60 Minutes' in 2014 as an experienced educator discussing the starting age of children into school. Warren gained his Masters degree through Boston College USA and ACU.

Warren has a particular interest in highlighting the learning needs of boys and their participation in the life of the school community. Furthermore, he is keen to assist teachers and parents in understanding:

- how boys think,
- how they can build resilience,
- how they best learn,
- and what the benefits can be for girls.

Warren and his wife, Clare have four children: two boys and two girls and 7 grandchildren.
