PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear students, parents and teachers,

Welcome to Term 2. I hope everyone had a chance to rest and celebrate Easter together. Easter is the focus for our faith as we recognise Christ overcoming death and offering new life to us all.

"If Jesus is risen, then - and only then - has something truly new happened, something that changes the state of humanity and the

It is with great sadness that I inform you of the passing of Mrs Gavin's father. Some of the staff attended his funeral on Monday in support of Mrs Gavin and her family. I know you will join with me in praying for them at this difficult time. Mrs Gavin will return to us next week.

We are now accepting enrolments for Kindergarten 2015 and we have begun the interviewing process. Enrolments close on Friday 30th May and any applications received after this date will be placed on a waiting list. If you have a child of school age or know of someone who does, please contact the school and ask for an enrolment form. Alternatively you can download a form from our website.

The Parish Craft show will be held on Saturday 3rd May. This is a great opportunity to support our local Parish Community. I hope that lots of families will attend (For more information see the following pages).

An important reminder that the last day of this term -27th June, will be a pupil free day. Our staff will be involved in a spirituality day as part of our professional development.

Our next School Mass in the Parish will be held on Sunday 4th May at 10.00am. I hope that lots of our families will be able to attend as our children have been invited to participate in the choir, greeters, collectors, readers and the offertory procession. This is a great way to enhance our Parish community.

This year the official date for wearing the school winter uniform will be Monday 12th May. It will be important that the children are all in the winter uniform as we will be having our school photos taken the following week on Monday 19th May. Just a reminder also that running shoes, worn on sports days, need to be predominantly white.



Some reminder letters have been sent home to families and I really appreciate the quick response to this uniform requirement. Wearing brightly coloured shoes can often lead to the wearing of wrist bands and coloured hair bands and other non-uniform items being worn. I would ask that all students are wearing the correct shoes by Term 2. If we are to have a uniform I believe we need to be true to its purpose - to establish in our students, a sense of readiness for learning and pride in their school. Sports shoes can be purchased from the uniform shop.

During the week beginning 12th May the students from Years 3 and 5 will be engaged in NAPLAN testing. This is always seen an opportunity to look at one form of assessment and use the information to support our learning programs. It is not an assessment of the whole school but an opportunity for parents and teachers to analyse the progress of these two groups so far. I encourage all our Year 3 and Year 5 students to do their best.

Next week the Mothers Day stall will be held on Wednesday 7th May. The children will have the opportunity to purchase gifts for their mothers. We will also be having a special Mothers Day liturgy on Friday 9th May at 9.00am in the playground. All parents are welcome to attend – especially our mums !

On Friday 16th May we will be having a mufti day for the whole school and an Infants (Kinder to Year 2 students) Disco. Our mufti day will be held to raise money for our fete. We ask parents to donate a gold coin so that we can begin purchasing items and booking rides for our fete in September. The infants Disco will be a great opportunity for the children to enjoy some music and the parents to meet in our main playground area.

<u>READING WITH YOUR CHILD</u>

"Sounding it out does not work very often!"



This is what we often hear adults tell children but how helpful is it? It seems to me that "sounding out" relies on already being able to read the word ... or at the very least

on knowing multiple sounds for letters and letter-combinations! Have a go at "sounding out" some of these words in this text ... e.g., "w-h-a-t" ... does it "say" what if you don't already know the 'wh' combination and the 'a' making a 'short o' sound?

Help your child to <u>work out words</u> they can't read straight away by pausing, prompting and praising while they read:

<u>Pause</u> to give your child *time* to work out the word <u>Prompt</u> your child to help them work out the word by:

- looking at the first letter and thinking about a word that starts with that letter that might make sense
- going back to the beginning of the sentence to try again
- reading past the difficult word to the end of the sentence and then thinking about a word that matches the starting letter/sound that might make sense
- thinking about another word that looks similar (might help them work it out)
- looking for smaller words or sounds they know within the word (eg, knowing the *tr* sound might enable them to work out *train*; knowing the words *it* and *ten* might help them work out *kitten* (k-it-ten)

When your child suggests a word, ask them:

Does (the word suggested) make sense?

- Does (the word suggested) sound right?
- Does (the word suggested) look right?

Don't spend toolong on trying to work out a word – if they can't work it out, tell them and move on **Praise** your child for trying - even if mistakes are made

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
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
