### PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear students, parents and teachers,

We are now accepting enrolments for Kindergarten 2015 and we have begun the interviewing process. **Enrolments close on Friday 30<sup>th</sup> May** and any applications received after this date will be placed on a waiting list. If you have a child of school age or know of someone who does, please contact the school and ask for an enrolment form. Alternatively you can download a form from our website.

On Monday this week a letter was sent home regarding the *Diocesan Works Fund* also known as *faith@work*. The fund is designed to support the many activities of our Diocese including those that support families in our community. Some families have contributed to this fund via envelopes distributed at Sunday Masses. For those families that haven't contributed we would ask that you consider donating during this week.

- Talk about the story, the pictures, the words, the ideas etc;
- Select appropriate materials and have a variety;

- Allow time for self correction;
- Have fun with reading;
- Use reading opportunities like signs and recipes;
- Build and use a collection of favourite stories;
- Develop your child's vocabulary by modelling the use of new words.

# 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Easter

# "I have come so that they may have life and have it to the full"

Last Sunday's Gospel talks to us about an image that we are very familiar with: Jesus, the Shepherd.

Many farmers have sheep; some in large flocks where each sheep is anonymous except for maybe an ear tag or some sort of branding and others who are in small flocks where each sheep might be known by name. Farmers with large flocks and people with just a few sheep both care for their sheep with passion and skill.

The metaphor Jesus uses in this Gospel relates to the small flocks of sheep that were common in His time. Each flock was looked after by a shepherd who new each sheep by name, on a very individual basis. They had a very personal relationship with their carer, the shepherd, and it is this fact which is at the heart of Jesus' message in this gospel.

As human beings each of us needs to be known by others. It is these relationships that sustain us and enable us to "have life and have it to the full".

Being known to someone means more than them just remembering our name. Relationships are built when we are *truly* known to people. We make others aware of our life history, our family connections and community networks our successes and even our failures.

Jesus offers us this kind of relationship. He wants us to let Him know our *true* self. This is the "knowing" he means when he talks about the shepherd calling the sheep "one by one".

As human beings we may often be very private people or only truly reveal ourselves to a select trusted few. Our relationship with Jesus is completely different. There is no part of us which is unknown to Him. He is the only one who knows more about ourselves than we do and it is Him who helps this to be revealed.

Our relationship with Jesus the Shepherd could potentially be the most honest and transparent relationship we ever have! This relationship is the key to "having life and having life to the full".

"I am the good shepherd; I know my sheep and my sheep know me "-John 10:14

### **ACTIVE KIDS ARE HEALTHY KIDS....**

Carrying a heavy backpack can be a source of chronic strain and can cause shoulder, neck and back pain in children.

The Australian Physiotherapy Association recommends the following with regards to children's backpacks:

- Keep the load close to the spine-pack the heaviest items nearest to your child's back;
- Chidlren must ear both straps at all times;
- Backpacks should always weigh less than 10% of your child's bodyweight;
- Encourage your child to be physically active-this will help them build and maintain a strong spine.
- Encourage your child to be organised when packing their bag to ensure they are only carrying what they need;
- Encourag3 your child to use waist and chest straps to help transfer some of the load to the hips and pelvis.




