Yesterday **Mr Warren Hopley**, retired Principal from **Sydney Diocese**, spoke to our Year 5 and 6 children about a project involving building a school in **South Sudan**. He brought with him **Mr Johnson Derang** who lived in Sudan and came to Australia as a refugee. The project has begun with the purchase of land and the building of one classroom and a teacher's residence. Less than 1% of girls in Sudan have access to secondary education. This is a special project as it involves my brother working to build a school undervery difficult circumstances but more importantly it is a very practical way in which our children can help other children in need. Facebook and other applications have a **12 year old** registration requirement which means none of our students should have accounts. These applications are a great form of communication if they are used appropriately and with parent supervision.

Many of our children have now completed their **first Reconciliation**. **Congratulations** to these children who have attained a Sacrament of imitation in our Catholic faith. We will soon be publishing the dates for next year's Sacramental programs.

The Parable of the Talents (Matthew 25: 14 – 30)

In this weekend's Gos pel we hear yet another example of how we cannot be passive and sit back and do nothing if we are to be true followers of Christ!

In the Parable of the Talents the master entrusts different amounts of money to his three servants according to their varying abilities.

Two of these servants realise that the master wants a return on his money, so they invest it and each double it. The master does not expect to get the same amount back from the two men because they started with different amounts. But they both received exactly the same praise because they both gave him a one hundred per cent return on his investment.

The servant of least ability, on the other hand, buried the money for fear of losing it. Instead of praising him for being conservative, the master was outraged! I'm sure we would all be outraged too if we had invested some money only to find out that years later it had not grown at all.

The master was angry because the servant had allowed fear to paralyse him. He was so afraid of losing money that he did not even take the very modest risk of depositing the money in the bank!

The Lord has entrusted lots of things to us: money, natural talents, spiritual gifts, the saving truth of the Gospel. He expects us not just to conserve these things but to grow them. Whatever work we are involved in, be it economic, family or friends, the goal should be to develop, increase, and grow what God has given us, for his honor and glory. This involves taking risks and not letting the fear of failure stand in our way!

Let us express our gratitude to God for all that He has given us by making it grow.

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PARISH NEWS:

A message from Fr. Paul ...

"I am not a Christian because "it makes sense" or because someone sat down and diagrammed it for me. I am a Christian because I have been loved deeply and unconditionally by Christians. Some of them troubled me with hard questions. But all of them loved me when I did not love them...Reason is a wonderful tool, but it is a weak force for deep change in human beings. Faith, hope and love are not tools; they are virtuesand more efficacious than reason for changing lives."

(Paul Wallace, Why I am a Christian 8 May 2012.)

Culturally, as Australians, we are extremely private about our faith and we really need to be empowered and encouraged (I speak as a priest, too) and literally schooled in basic evangelisation techniques. **Sherry Weddell**, author of the book "**Forming Intentional Disciples**" will propose some really concrete measures for this to help dynamise the latent talent of our parishes:

- 1. In our Catholic faith we talk endlessly about the Church but so seldom about Christas a person with whom we are in relationship
- 2. To explain and show the need to break the silence about our faith and equip us, as parishioners, to integrate these methods, not only in the public forum of our lives but in our daily conversations with others on various matters
- 3. The real need to turn existing ministries into evangelisation opportunities-re-thinking how we do groups in the parish
- 4. As Group leaders, above all, to show to our parishes and communities the need to 'Expect God to work' and to move our mindset into disceming how to work with the Holy Spirit.

We can also expect, as leaders or potential leaders of faith, that Sherry Weddell will further equip us to talk more intentionally about our faith and form in our minds a deeper appreciation of what it means to be 'a disciple.'

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
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
