Dear Parents, teachers and students

In the last newsletter I referred to a number of problems that had occurred with Kiss and Ride. Following is a letter from a concerned parent that has been reiterated by other parents with complaints about dropping off children in the morning:

"Kiss and Ride of a morning sees many parents dropping off their children to school. Cars line up on Lloyd Street and wait their turn. On many occasions, vehicles coming up Braeside Road join the queue without waiting their turn on Lloyd St. This disrespect for other people who are waiting their turn is just that - disrespect for fellow parents and students, and for the rules that apply to everyone, not just a few. We model behaviour for our children. This behaviour models disrespect for others - no one is above respecting other people."

From Monday 11th June Merrylands Police will be patrolling our school in unmarked vehicles. I know that the majority of our families use the Kiss and Ride system well and I would ask that we are all part of keeping children safe and being respectful to others.
