I recognise that the discovery of asbestos fragments in the excavated soil of the building site has caused you concern. Congratulations to our Year 3 and Year 5 students who completed the first week of NAPLAN online assessments last week. It has been reported that some schools have experienced significant technical issues, which impacted on their ability to complete the tests. We experienced some technical issues prior to the tests, and had to delay its start, but since then we have been fortunate to only have experienced minor issues. Our final NAPLAN test was this week, and all catch up tests were also completed. Once again, well done to the students for navigating their way through these successfully.

In the coming weeks, the schools in our diocese will be involved in an online survey that provides feedback about their experiences of their schools. The survey, called Tell Them From Me (TTFM), is an important part of our whole school evaluation and planning process, and we will be inviting students, teachers and parents to participate. The information you provide will be used to maintain our commitment to working together in partnership to further improve student learning and wellbeing at Our Lady Queen of Peace School. More information about the surveys will be sent home soon.

The recent bombings of Churches and hotels in Sri Lanka have a had a devastating impact on the communities in that country. Catholic communities have been terribly affected by these attacks. Fr Chris De Souza, Episcopal Vicar for Education and Formation in the Diocese of Parramatta, led a Requiem Mass for the victims of the attack last Sunday 19 May at St Nicholas of Myra Parish.

Our teachers are currently assessing students in preparation for the half yearly reports. Reading remains the most significant skill that your children will develop. Reading should be enjoyable and something the whole family is involved in. Try to ensure that your children get to hear you read to them or with them every night. Ascertain whether or not your children are gaining meaning from what they are reading by discussing what they have read. There is such a broad choice of outstanding literature to choose from now, and reading should be a real alternative to television and devices.

A reminder to ensure you are not sending your children to school if they are unwell. Cold and flu symptoms such as coughs and sneezes are contagious, and can in turn infect others. Quite often rest and fluids can ease these symptoms.

Our Kiss and Ride process is operating more smoothly as cars move more quickly through the circuit. Please ensure that the child's name/family name is clearly displayed on your dashboard and that it remains there until he/she is picked up. This gives the teachers on duty a chance to call the name if your child has not responded. Please make sure that you move right up to the end of the circuit so more cars can enter. We have put extra staff on duty at dismissal time to ensure things flow as smoothly as they can.

Recently we had a wonderful Children's Mass that was very well attended by parents, children and staff. These children's liturgies are held on the first Sunday of each month and are a wonderful opportunity to worship together as both a school and parish community. We invite you all to attend our next children's mass, on June 2nd, at 10:00 am.
